#### Introduction to bark incisions

Research will show that tree bark has been used by man across continents and cultures for practical purposes since ancient times. Traditionally bark has been used for containers, clothing, shelter, making boats, decoration in masks, headdresses and more recently for extracting useful drugs. Google images searches will show many examples of the way in which bark has been and can still be utilised in making. The Japanese kabazaiku tradition of using cherry bark and the Eastern European birch bark ware or beresta are two examples of a continuing traditional approach to bark craft.

My interest, being expressed in bark incision, was generated some years ago by Dorothy Gill Barnes whom I was fortunate to engage in conversation during a visit to the UK where some of her work was being exhibited at the Barbican in London. She was staying locally to me at that time, for a few days, at a friend's house. She explained how she used an interpretation of the dendroglyph utilising both the marked bark (created by her) and the underlying healing growth of the wood, in the construction of some of her pieces.

A dendroglyph is a symbol or pictograph carved into the bark of a tree, sometimes sacred they are linked in archaeological or historical descriptions to the trees on the Chatham Islands of New Zealand.

Sometimes marks or symbols on trees are described by the terms silvaglyph, arbourglyph and more commonly tree graffiti.

Most of the tree bark photographs and works I am showing here might best be described as tree graffiti and come from Gulhane Park in Istanbul. Some tend to drift towards the dendroglyph as the ageing process causes the loss of literal

interpretation and they become more symbolic.

Below you will find some examples of damage to bark that has regrown or healed and one example of recent tree damage caused by animals and in this example, probably deer.







#### Gulhane Park

The park is situated in the Eminonu District of Istanbul, Turkey adjacent to and formerly part of the Topkapi Palace. The Museum of the History of Science and Technology of Islam is in the grounds and the Archaeological Museums are close by. As in most parks in cities, trees and flowers form the backdrop to this open space. In this case the most popular tree used in the planting is the Platanus orientalis or Oriental Plane known for its great height, large crown and long life. A feature of this tree is the shedding of its bark during growth. The timber is usually known as Lacewood.

The park is well used by the local population and is a popular visitor attraction. Young couples feature large and are probably responsible for much of the graffiti on the trees but there are also political and protest messages evident too. The following pictures show marks and incisions of unknown content and age. The flaking bark adds to the air of mystery that surrounds some of the imagery and this encourages the digital interpretations I have made in the latter pages of this publication.







## Dendroglyph Pictures

The following images show signs, symbols and words carved into the bark of the plane trees. Some are old some are newish. The bark colours ranged from light green to dark green background with lighter areas of brown and cream colours. Most of the darker brown bark pieces show signs of shedding away from the main trunk. These are a selection from some 100 dendroglyph/graffiti images taken in Istanbul, Spring 2010.



























































# Digital interpretations and derivative images
